



NWF EcoLeader Graduate Student Fellowship Opportunities: In Spring 2014, National Wildlife Federation launched the EcoLeaders Program to help students and young professionals develop sustainability leadership skills and secure great jobs that help the planet. The EcoLeaders leadership and career development program advances a proven model of leadership for sustainability. It draws on the lessons learned over nearly three decades supporting thousands of sustainability projects at more than 2,000 colleges and universities across the U.S. and world through NWF's Campus Ecology, Greenforce, and other programs. Summer Immersion Tropical Farm Retreat: There are two different opportunities: JUNE 5 - 10: Summer Immersion, a week-long program focusing on gardening, eco-living, and an introduction to permaculture. The National Environmental Policy Act Course: This course from November 2-3rd consists of approximately 12.5 hours of continuing education, including 1 hour of ethics. You must let us know, at least 45 days in advance of the conference, the states or organizations for which you will need credit (see registration form). Credit hours for states will vary and are subject to each state's approval and credit rounding rules. Foundation conferences are typically accredited by all mandatory CLE states and Canadian provinces, the AAPL, NADOA and NALTA, and other professional organizations. Internships/Fellowships:

Powderhorn Creek Ranch Summer Internship: Cindi West, has a HUGE opportunity for one of our ENVS or MEM students (Undergrad or Graduate) to work on the Powderhorn Creek Ranch, a 135 Acre ranch located 30 minutes southwest of Gunnison off CR-25, she has two big projects this year. Here's a brief description of her two projects: The first project, is a work-related project focused on holistic land management, grazing strategies, and organic sustainable practices. Work would entail developing strategies to become more resilient to climate change. The second project, is a water management project related to the development of a newly found water spring on the ranch, work would entail water conservation practices and strategic water use planning to fully utilize this newly found resource. Possible Student Project:

Currently homes in the old Irwin townsite are required to have leach field and not permitted to install incinerating facilities for human waste. Do leach fields produce more pollution than an incinerating toilet? Investigating these techniques, and the consequences associated with each could be a project that would not only benefit the community, but also the headwaters. Soil Health Research Assistant

Intern will assist with both field soil sampling and lab testing. Field work will take place in August and September and consist of collecting soil core samples and running soil infiltration tests in sagebrush pastures used for cattle grazing. Long days of exposed field work with moderate hiking can be expected. Experience with basic data collection desired (using a GPS unit, following established protocols, flexibility and adaptability, etc). Lab work will run from the end of the field season through the end of the fall semester and consist of assisting with soil ignition testing. More specifically intern will assist with preparing samples (grinding, sieving, weighing and drying samples), initiating testing (operating lab furnace), and recording results (post-ignition mass). Attention to detail, ability to follow directions, and reliable punctuality desired as testing is highly time-dependent. Hours will vary over the course of the internship, with more hours required (15-20) during the field season, and fewer (5-10) during lab work. Opportunities may exist to assist with planned analyses, develop further analyses, or assist with literature research.
