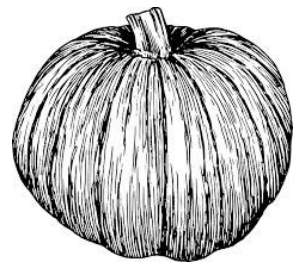


Pictured above is Master Student Ayodeji who welcomed his second son, David Oluwalana, to the world on September 23rd.

Environmental Justice Conference: Call for paper and session proposals Environmental Justice in the Anthropocene Symposium, **24-25 April 2017, at Colorado State University, Fort Collins, USA Proposal deadline: is next Tuesday, November 1, 2016** Environmental justice (EJ) is a central component of sustainability politics during the Anthropocene – the current geological age when human activity is the dominant influence on climate and environment. CSU is inviting proposals for papers and sessions (self-organized panels or roundtables) that explore these and other aspects of EJ from academics, independent researchers, community and movement activists, and regulatory and policy practitioners. The symposium will be a two-day event during which a limited number of presenters will be able to interact and engage in meaningful dialogue amongst themselves and with a diverse and informed audience. 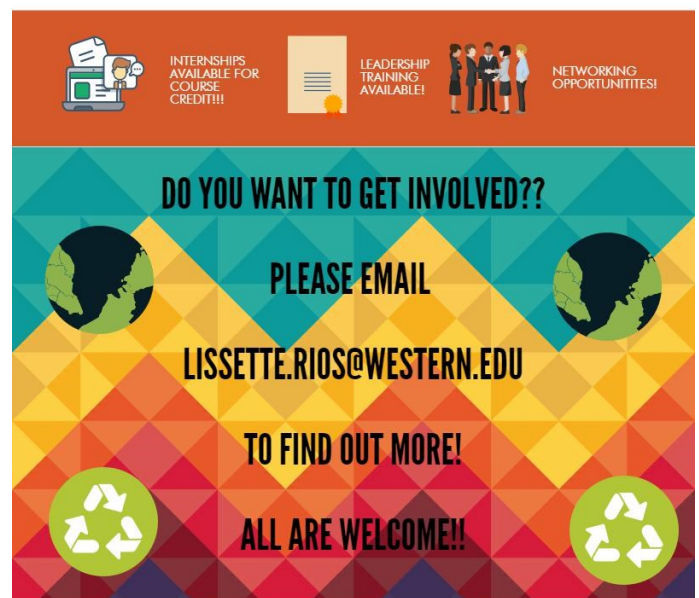
Further Items of Interest:
