Professor of the Week: Before **Luke Danielson** came back to Colorado, he was working in London for a research institute and had attended the 2002 Earth Summit with the promise of a job in Southeast Asia. Before working, he visited Colorado where he later met his wife. He currently is the president of the non-profit Sustainable Development Strategies Group (SDSG), works at his law office here in Gunnison, and has taught at four different universities, currently the University of Tuscan, Arizona and previously the University of Denver. His mission at SDSG is helping train students to do what they do there. His recent travels to Mongolia with SDSG was mainly to focus on improving the way non-renewable resources are managed there such as oil, gas, and minerals to prevent environmental degradation. Luke has also worked with a course that twenty-two officials from other countries has taken to make sure interests are protected. Luke has also traveled to the Philippines, Indonesia. China, and some island states through SDSG. Luke soon will be at Western to talk about his recent trip to Mongolia, so be on the lookout for that!

vegan chef for a sustainable cooking night.


Further Items of Interest:
