### MEM student of the Week

Ryan Wilbur, an Integrated Land Management studen, is working on his project on Assessing Bias in Human-Black Bear Conflict Reporting in Durango, Colorado. As human-black bear conflicts increase, there are potential increases in negative impacts on black bear survivability, increased public safety concerns, and high management costs. Wildlife managers estimate the severity and spatial trends of human-bear conflict by monitoring voluntary conflict reporting. His research aims to understand potential bias in voluntarily reported black bear conflicts versus the real frequency and distribution of human-black bear conflicts.
