- 00-116 Mrs. Sweeney, Elscamp, Crackaw Early history of grandparents. They moved to the west from Missouri; came part of the way by covered wagon. Moved to various parts of the country before settling in Telluride. Grampa Naim had a truck garden across the river. Speaks of other families that lived there. Yvonne was born across the river and moved into town at the age of 3. Grampa was watchman for various mills and grandmother cooked at boarding houses.
- 116-17 Porterfields Early history of parents. Tells story of how they met. Guy Warrick and Viola Naren were married when Viola was 15. Speaks of uncle that fought in WWI. Speaks of relationship to Porterfields.
- 170-232 W. Long, Gallo Father worked for Railway Express for many years. They moved to Virginia for a year during the depression, then back to Telluride. Lived at Matterhorn for 1 summer while their father worked on the road in 1931. Father was elected sheriff in 1932 and held that office for 20 years. Speaks of brothers and sisters.
- 232-345 Hardy, M. Tek., F. Hess, El Glazer, J. Swanson, W, Wooster, J > Munroe, B. Cassietto, C. Adams, V. Anderson, E. Gustafson, O. Bowe rs, E. Paul, B. Balliger, J. Mahoney School years. Names the graduating class. Speaks of Edwin Glazer, the school superintendent that married his 18 year old student. Describes their wedding. Talks about the Swanson house and the many childhood memories. Foreign languages were offered in high school. Names teachers. The year Eileen graduated, the Glee Club took 1st place on the western slope. Yvonne played on girls basketball team. Winter activities were coasting and skating.
- 345-395 Father was sheriff from 1932 until 1946, then dropped out and went into the sawmill business. Ran again for sheriff and won. Speaks of Cassagrande murder.
- 395-453 Story of father breaking a large high grading ring in 1939. Father made lots of enemies during his years of sheriff. Stories of bootlegging.
- 453-497 Gerrardi, J. Gillmore, Parsons, A. Mulvey, T. Mahoney Stories of the "ladies on the line".
- 497-590 Snodgrass story. Father led many search parties for him. Also tells the story of MCDaniels brothers. Speaks of visiting prisoners in the jail. There were no facilities for women in the jail, so father took them Snodgrass, Herman MCDaniel, Dunlop,

Smitt, Cassagrande Continues stories about father's life as a sheriff. Names different women that were jailed. Mother cooked for prisoners. Eileen and Yvonne delivered the meals to the jail. Mother earned \$1 a day for cooking 3 meals.
- 75-156 Sweeney, Miller Yvonne mentions the scrap book she made for her father's 40th birthday. Talks about several relatives that went into law enforcement . Parents moved to Tulsa , OK. in 1950, then moved back. Father died in 1966. Mother owned a dress shop in Telluride for many years at different locations.
- 156-200 Sweeney, E.Murrey, the silent movies. Memories of all the dances they attended. B.Palmer, B.Nardine, Yvonne's husband played in the Arabian Knights Dance Band for B.Smith, W.Whitson several years. Dances were held at the recreation hall. Eileen speaks of her love for Telluride. Talks about decorating the recreation hall for proms and graduations. Memories of the Commoweal Valentine Dance, Elks Christmas Dance, and New Years Eve Dance. Speaks of the social lodges in town.
- 250-306 Clementi, Silver Describes the Christmas baskets that were given on Main Street on Christmas Day. Eileen talks about the community spirit. Talks about Dollar Saloon, Melvindances at Ophir, Sawpit, Leonard, Rico and Norwood. Bishop
- 306-390 D. Murphy, J. Eileen speaks of summers she spent with grandparents at their ranch 6 miles below Rico. She rode back and forth on the Galloping Goose. Dempsey Rode the train from Telluride to Virginia in 1929. Tells the story of meeting Jack Dempsey in the depot in Cincinnati.
- 390-421 Elscamp, Yvonne's first husband was an Elscamp. His parents owned the grocery store. Eileen speaks of husband Bill, and their children. Gustafson, H.
- 421-592 Wright, Mrs. Paul Rationing stamps during World War II. Eileen lived with her parents part of the time while her husband was in the service for two years. T.McMahn, Swede Their brother was killed in the war. Memories of the depression years. Marie, Big Billie, Mrs. Story of Tom McMahn. Describes his wife and family. Mrs. McMahn was a good friend of their mother. Memories of Swede Marie and Big Karcher, Mrs. Litchfield Billie. Describes Mrs. Karcher who was a seamstress.
