00-122	Lavender, T. Dempsey, Alex Carriere, Elscamp, Goldsworthy, Perino, Fischer	Wilbert (Bud) Carriere was born in 1904 in Telluride. His father was a mule skinner for the mines. Describes his life as a mule skinner. Names his brothers and sisters. Speaks of the house he lived in at Pandora. Talks of childhood activities. Groceries were delivered by wagon from shops in town.
122-186	Vanetta, Fleckinstine, K, O'Kelly	He attended school in Telluride. Names various teachers he had. Speaks of classes offered in Jr. and Sr. High School. Describes the bus he rode to school.
186-222	Buckley Wells, T. Clark, Eli Marshall	He worked for his father while attending school and during the summer. Worked at the Smuggler Union Mine in the shop after graduating from school. Speaks of Buckley Wells.
222-258	Grimes	Bud worked at the Bridal Veil Power Plant for years. Names other men that worked there. He worked at the Smuggler Union Mine from 1928 until it shut down.
258-268		Describes skiing as a young man.
268-307	Mrs. Sweeney	Talks of meeting his wife, Mildred and their marriage. Describes July 4th celebrations and horse races at San Miguel. Talks of the many dances and where they were held.
307-366	B. Parker, Grimes	Speaks of the boot legging operations in Pandora and on the mesas. He and Midge lived in Pandora when they were first married. Bought the house in town in 1939. Speaks of the depression.
366-395	Hicks and Gifford	Describes the Ajax snow slide at Pandora that Mrs. Hicks and Gifford were killed in. Speaks of other snow slides. Mentions his retirement in 1969.
