00-67	Harry Cline	Speaks of his arrival in Telluride in 1928 with Harry Cline. Tells story of riding the train to Rico to work. Started Working in the Smuggler Mine in 1931 and worked there until 1935 when he left town.
67-119	Adams	Speaks of various houses he lived in. Describes "Step And A Half" Adams and the house they bought from him and items that were left in the house.
119-168	Goldsworthy, Pilcher, Yisintine	Names various businesses in town. Describes Pilcher's Meat Market. Speaks of the charge accounts at various markets. Milk was obtained from Yisintine Dairy.
168-232	Denny Mulligan	Talks of the wages made in the mine. Describes the horrible working conditions at the mine in Rico. Mentions the bad accident he was involved in there. The Smuggler mine was a good place to work.
232-258		Describes July 4th celebrations. Speaks of the many dances they attended.
258-328	Dr. Parker, Ann Fancher, D. Pilcher, Grimes	Names several doctors and nurses that worked at the hospital. Speaks of the depression years and the government relief provided. No mines were open during the depression. Tells of Grimes opening the mines after the depression.
328-362		Describes riding the train to Rico. Speaks of the year the snow slide closed the rail road into Rico and also talks of 2 other snow slides that killed people that year.
362-399	B. Parker, C.D. Waggoner	The first skiing was over near Adams Ranch. Describes incident at Silver Bell Saloon. Talks about C.D. Waggoner and the bank scandal.
