00-59	Ossev Dill,	Early history of parents. Grandparents were from Germany and Ireland. Grandfather was a machinist and arrived in Telluride in 1895 to work at the Smuggler mine. Describes houses he lived in as a youth.
59-143	Ross, Pichers, Evidley, Adams, H. Brewer, Lora, Bekkanna, Big Billy, Fusan	Talks about various ethnic groups in town. Names various grocery stores and other businesses in town. Names saloons and bars in town. Describes the credit system in grocery stores.
143-209	K. McNight	Talks about trapping in winter time for muskrats and etc. and selling the hides to Montgomery Wards. Describes area they trapped in. Mentions Kelly McNight's diary. Activities as a young boy. Nick names of various areas he played in as a boy.
209-249	G. Battz, V. Hardy, F. Wright, Clinton, McKinney	Bucky's father was inspector for Air Force in Tucson for a couple of years during World War II. Names teachers. Describes size of classes in school and names various organizations and sports. Attended last 3 years of high school in military school.
249-319	Anderson, Larson, Belzite	Father started working for Tomboy in 1916. Mother was registered pharmacist and worked at the Busy Corner Pharmacy. Memories of the first jobs he had as a young boy. Memories of the train. Train quit running in 1952. Rode the Galloping Goose to Trout Lake to fish—fare 10 cents each way.
319-374	T. Hedlund, Porterfield, Ferguson,	Winter activities included ice skating. Describes area where they skated. Describes early days of skiing and equipment used. Story of friend pulling Bucky on skis behind car to Ophir. Lots of sleigh riding on Lawson Hill. Not many jobs available for young boys to earn money. Family outings to Trout Lake to fish and family celebrated holidays with other family members. Grandfather was County Judge for many years.
